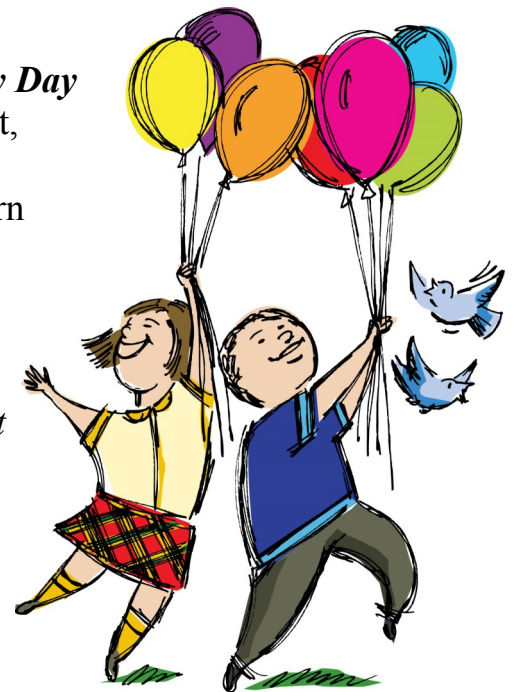

Message from Pastor Gordon Peterson



On Vitality: *Extreme Makeover: Congregation Edition*

If you have a television in your home and spent any time channel surfing during the past five or six years, you may be familiar with Ty Pennington's visit to a family living in some city, suburb or small town with his now famous: "Good Morning!" If you resist changing the channel, you know what comes next.

A team of hundreds, including general contractors, designers, plumbers, carpenters, electricians, landscapers, etc. come together to race the clock and take just a few days to rebuild one very tired dwelling. They just don't build any old house. They rebuild the homes of some very deserving family who do not have the means to change their living circumstances without the help of their neighbors or, in this case, the award winning program, *Extreme Makeover: Home Edition*.

Today is my fourth day at Prince of Peace Lutheran Church. I'm still settling-in and finding my way into the rhythm of this community of faith. As I get settled, I spend time looking through the 2007 Membership Directory (the one with photos) and I pray for you and wonder what God's Spirit has been up to in this part of God's holy garden. Even after a short time, I can see that God has blessed you and in so many ways others through your faithful witness to the Good News of Jesus.

In my conversations, I'm learning that Prince of Peace is not a stranger to challenge and change. It's not always easy to meet the challenge or move through the change, but you do it. You meet each new day knowing that God is with you in both your comings and in your goings.

And yet, I'm sure there are some in our midst who feel a bit weary. There may even be some who are really concerned about the future of Prince of Peace and wondering what God has in mind for Prince of Peace as we face, yet, another time of transition. In the life cycle of every faith community, there are opportunities to consider our calling to God's work. It can be a time of transformation or even a makeover.

Otto Sharmer in his book, *Theory U: Leading from the Future as it Emerges*, says that the leader's real work is to help people discover the power of seeing and seeing together. During the coming year, the Transition Team, the Congregation Council, Pastor Anita, the staff and I will be interested in what you see. Do you see opportunity for new life? Do you see something new emerging at Prince of Peace? Do you see the possibility of letting go and letting come? As God's Holy Spirit brings new life again and again, what are we able to see together?

One of the difficulties with writing newsletter articles is that they need to be done many days before the information written gets to its targeted readers. I am still in the middle of summer, as I sit down to write this. I have one more trip to the cabin with the Senior High Youth.

All three cabin trips this year have focused on creation. We have read the creation stories in Genesis. We have read Psalms to help us focus on God as Creator. We have heard over and over that God is our Creator. He has created everything. And everything he creates is good. We are his created and therefore, we are good. God loves us and all of his creation—the earth and everything in it.

What should guide the use of genetic knowledge in medicine, agriculture and other arenas is ‘to respect and promote the community of life with justice and wisdom.’ (Quoted from Frequently Asked Questions)

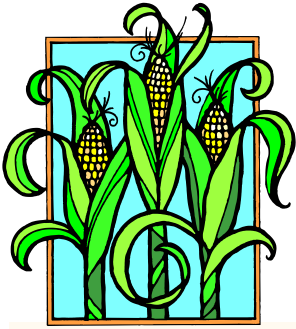
