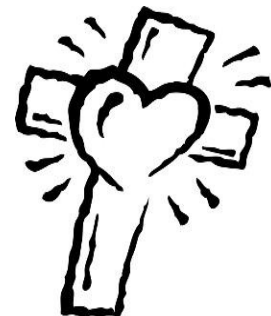

Message from Senior Pastor Anita Beste



The Nominating Committee is a small committee – only 3 people. But they do enormously important work in support of the ministry of other committees and structures -- they nominate others to serve as Council members or Chairs of most of our standing committees. It's mostly behind the scenes work; they steadfastly meet throughout the fall to look at all the members in the congregation, wonder aloud about who has gifts for service in various areas, and then call them to see if they are willing and able to serve at this time. Anne Olson, Jon Lentsch, and Kate VandenBosch served on the Nominating Committee this year and their report will be in the congregation's Annual Report. Come to the Annual Meeting Sunday, January 30 at noon. And thank Anne, Jon and Kate for their good work.

In working with the Nominating Committee and so many different church volunteers over the years I've come to believe a few things about this process.

I believe people know when to say "Yes" and when to say "No." I encourage people to listen to their gut, and their heart, when asked to serve in some capacity. Does it match your passion? Do you have gifts to share in this area? Is the timing right for you right now? Is there a clear need? Do you sense a sense of call?

We want people to yes to church work out of a sense of joy, not guilt. And for the sake of participating in God's mission, not just to fill an empty slot. If you're terrified of speaking in front of people, then you shouldn't be a reader at worship, but maybe you could volunteer to prepare the bread and wine for communion and set it out on the table. If your passion is children, then we'd love to have you teach Sunday School or serve on the Children's Ministry Committee, but somebody else should organize the Habitat for Humanity work crew.

I also believe individuals – and congregations – go through different chapters in their lives. A person may be very involved volunteering in 3 or 4 different organizations for several years in a row. They are inspired and energized by their work. Then something changes – usually in them, but sometimes also in the organizations – and they find that it's time to step down from their volunteer work. Perhaps they are tired. Or maybe it's just time for new people and fresh ideas. They enter into a more interior stage of their life – maybe resting, maybe reexamining, or maybe caring for an ailing parent or friend. Then after a few years, circumstances change again, and they are ready to jump in again, volunteering with new energy and enthusiasm.

Congregations, too, go through stages in different volunteer areas at different times. For example, every summer since I've been here we've always had enough wonderful and organized volunteers to mow the lawn. But this fall we found ourselves in desperate need of somebody to coordinate the Wednesday Night Suppers. That gave us a chance to ask: Shall we not continue the suppers every Wednesday?

On Vitality: *God's Mission – Our Response*

“We, the baptized members of the Church of Christ, responding in faith to the call of the Holy Spirit through the Gospel, desiring to unite together to preach the Word, administer the sacraments, and carry out God’s mission” are the first words in the Preamble of Prince of Peace Lutheran Church’s “Church Constitution.” On Sunday, January 30, 2010 after worship, the baptized of Prince of Peace will gather for the annual meeting of the congregation. It will be the first opportunity of a brand new year for the entire congregation to be engaged in conversation about *God's Mission* and how *Our Response*.

This will be my first annual meeting at Prince of Peace. I’m looking forward to listening to the conversation about how the Holy Spirit continues to call and send God’s people to bear witness to God’s activity in the world. Annual meetings are a time to make decisions, elect and affirm leadership and take appropriate actions to fulfill our purpose as witnesses to God’s “creative, redeeming and sanctifying activity in the world” – God’s mission in Roseville and throughout the world

As we prepare for the annual meeting and consider how we shall be *church together* in 2011, I would suggest that we begin to have intentional conversations around foundational questions like: Who are we? What has God called us to do and to be? Who is our neighbor? What are our priorities? In order to be *church together*, it would be helpful to have these questions guide our conversations and prayer life for the coming months. These questions (and others like them), also, need to begin to frame the agendas of the congregation council, committees and staff when we meet in the coming weeks and months.

I recently read that “Nothing prepares a congregation to accept change more effectively than one or several opportunities to talk about the future when the first thing said is, ‘We will not be making a decision about this soon.’” This year will be an exciting time at Prince of Peace. You will be making decisions about ministry direction and the ways Prince of Peace will bear witness to God’s amazing grace and activity in the world. You will, also, make decisions about the best way to staff for God’s mission both in and through Prince of Peace Lutheran Church. Therefore, it is very important that we need to talk about the future before we make decisions about our life together.

I believe that the year 2011 will prove to be a pivotal year for the community and ministry of Prince of Peace Lutheran Church. I, also, believe it all begins with a conversation. As you are able, please join the conversation by sharing your gifts of experience, wisdom, insight, presence and hope for the future. See you on January 30th!

Greetings from Milt Warkentien - Music Coordinator

“Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.” This phrase should sound familiar to most of us, as it is the phrase we usually use to welcome a newly baptized person into our congregation. At first glance this seems like a nice, friendly and welcoming statement, but is it just a welcoming statement or a **call** to service? One might wonder, “What do I have to give that could possibly allow me to fulfill this statement?” One of my favorite Christmas songs is *Little Drummer Boy*. In this song, the little drummer boy doesn’t think he has anything to give to Jesus, but as he plays his drum, to the best of his abilities, he receives a smile from Jesus. I think this is what the phrase “Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven” is all about. The little drummer boy used his talents to give glory to God. What talents do we have to give glory to God?

During this season of Epiphany we will be centering worship around “mission”. I believe that “mission” has personal, local and global meaning. How can we “mission” to others if we can’t “mission” to ourselves? How can we "mission" locally if we can't "mission" in our own congregation? How can we “mission” globally if we can’t “mission” locally and in our own congregation? Maybe the phrase should read “Let your light so shine that you may “mission” to yourself and others, to the glory of God.” There are many ways which we can “mission” at Prince of Peace. **Take the time to get involved** and if music happens to be one of your talents, there are many ways the music team can help you “mission” musically!

In closing I’m going to use three different hymns. The first is the refrain from ELW 290 *Go Tell It on the Mountain*, “Go tell it on the mountain, over the hills and everywhere; go tell it on the mountain that Jesus Christ is born!” Notice the exclamation point. This isn’t just a statement, it’s an exclamation! We are **called** to tell that Christ is born. This exclamation states that we’re suppose to “mission” everywhere, not just here at prince of Peace.

“Let your light so shine that you may “mission” to yourself and others, to the glory of God.”

The second hymn is the 3rd verse of ELW 672 *Signs and Wonders*, “Cast aside all fear and hiding; hand in hand we dance the round. God is with us, Christ abiding, and the Spirit’s gifts abound. **Called** by God to holiness, let us boldly serve and bless; and to hearts that sigh and hunger may our lives dance signs and wonders.

The third is ELW 677 *This Little Light of Mine*. This simple and fun hymn simply says” This little light of mine, I’m goin’a let it shine..... **Ev’rywhere I go**, I’m goin’a let it shine..... Jesus gave it to me, I’m goin’a let it shine..... **let it shine, let it shine, let it shine.**”

Or change to once a month? What mission or ministry is supported by them? Does the congregation know that everyone – not just those in music or children’s programming – is invited to come and eat together from 5:30 – 6:30?

I give thanks for the creative and committed people who have served on the Worship Committee in recent years. But in the ways that committees ebb and flow, several of them have chosen to rotate off that committee this year. So, we are using that as an opportunity to look at ways of restructuring the work of tending to worship.

For 2011 short-term Worship Teams will be formed for a season – a liturgical season like Lent/Easter, Pentecost/Summer, Pentecost/Fall, and Advent/Christmas/Epiphany. We will meet 4-6 weeks ahead of the season to consider the scripture readings and themes, to design elements of worship using music, video, participation by children, etc., and to tend to the details of creating meaningful and well-executed worship. If you would like to consider this short-term and creative commitment to a Worship Team, please contact me for more information. (Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on March 9th, so the Lent Easter

Worship Team will meet some time in the last 2 weeks of January.)

As I observe the many volunteers at Prince of Peace, I am frequently deeply moved by the depth of your commitment and care. Of course there are areas where we need more people, but I give thanks for those people and those areas where we are going strong! Thank you for your sharing in the gospel – each in your own individual way as we discover and participate in God’s mission together.

I give thanks for the Nominating Committee – and their calling out the best in the gifts of our members. I give thanks for those Council Members and Committee Chairs who have served so well and will rotate off in January: Barb Burkhardt and Bonita Eliason (Council); and Deb Cordes (Worship), Dick Jacobson (Building), Kent Olson (Adult Education), Caryn Josephson (Global Mission), and Barb Burkhardt (New Members) . I give thanks for all those continuing in leadership positions. And I give thanks for all those people who have said Yes to stepping into a new role of leadership at Prince of Peace. 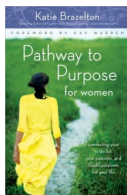

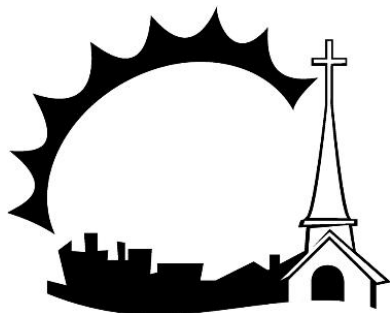
FOOD NEEDS CONTINUE

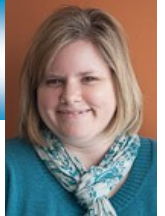
