Message from Senior Pastor Anita Beste

Looking Forward in 2011

In the same way that there is a different rhythm and energy to the different seasons of the church year – for example, the quiet confessional focus of Lent gives way to the joyous celebration of Easter – so there is a different rhythm and energy to different chapters in the life of a congregation. 2010 was a year of quiet pause: as we celebrated the changes in our building after a long renewal project, we paused before making additional plans; and we paused in creating new ministry initiatives as our calling was to walk together in our grief with a dying pastor.

I believe God is now calling us into a new chapter in 2011 with renewed energy and new hope and vision for our life and ministry together. The Transition Team is in the middle of their work to help us discover and articulate our next chapter in participating in God's mission. I appreciate their help and guidance in this important congregational task. In addition to the direction and mission that will come from the Transition Team's findings and then the Council's recommendations, I see at least two areas that merit our attention in the coming year:

- **Regular Building Maintenance/Improvements** – Fixing the roof or replacing windows is not as much fun as remodeling the sanctuary, but it is just as important. We need to care for our current building for the sake of our ongoing ministry, for the care of the Lake Ridge Child Care children and staff using our space, for service to the greater community (like a polling place), and for better stewardship of energy and God's creation. As a first step, I have asked the Property Committee to make an inventory of short-term and long-term building needs and goals; the Council and congregation will make a plan of action from there. Stay tuned for details and ways to help out.
- **Lay Leadership** – I am grateful for the quality and quantity of lay leaders already active and providing healthy leadership in this congregation. I especially want to thank the Council for their commitment and leadership this year. But I want to develop even more! On the one hand, a church needs to be respectful of the demands of time and energy already being placed on people in many areas of their lives. On the other hand, a church needs to both inspire and challenge its members to vitally engage in their personal spiritual growth and in the life and growth of the congregation. The mission and ministry of this congregation is supported by a teamwork of people and organizational structure. Each of you will be invited to discern your gifts and discover your part in our exciting next chapter together.

In 1 Corinthians, the Apostle Paul writes that “Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit, and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord, and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone.” Eugene Peterson’s “contemporary rendering of the Bible” in *The Message* puts it this way: “God’s various gifts are handed out everywhere; but they all originate in God’s Spirit. God’s various ministries are carried out everywhere; but they all originate in God’s Spirit. Each person is given something to do that shows who God is: Everyone gets in on it, everyone benefits.”

I appreciate Paul’s reminder that God’s gifts are being handed out everywhere and that “each person is given something to do that shows who God is.” It is helpful information to know that all of us have at least one gift. Unfortunately, I’ve read that 80 percent of all Christians have a difficult time naming their gifts. Eighty percent! If this is accurate accounting, are you a part of the 80 percent without a clue or the 20 percent, who have a pretty good idea about your gift(s) and are even willing to use them.

If you are part of the 80 percent, here’s something for your consideration – a little homework. Look at the list below and underline (*The 3 Colors of Ministry* by Christian A. Schwarz) your gifts – having trouble? Not sure about your gifts? Ask a friend what gifts they believe you’ve been given. Gifts: Artistic creativity, Craftsmanship, Giving, Hospitality, Knowledge, Mercy, Music, Organization, Voluntary poverty, Wisdom, Apostle, Counseling, Evangelism, Helps, Leadership, Missionary, Service, Shepherding, Singleness, Teaching, Deliverance, Discernment, Faith, Healing, Interpretation, Miracles, Prayer, Prophecy, Suffering, Tongues.

According to the New Testament, each gift that is given is to be used to build up the body of Christ. So ... let’s build!!

We are now about half way thru Epiphany and Pastor Gordon's words are still ringing in my ears. If you missed the services on Jan. 2nd you should check out a CD of that service. Gordon centered his sermon message on the Hymn "Christ Be Our Light" by Bernadette Farrell.

The hymn is # 715 in the ELW for those that want to refresh their memory. This hymn calls all of us to be carriers of Christ's Light and Gordon challenged us as a congregation to be a giant beacon of Christ's Light.

As a church in transition, we have many questions that need addressing. Some of them are, what will the staffing be at Prince of Peace? Will we ever have a roof that doesn't leak? What groups do we want to continue to support and are there other groups that we should support too or instead? These questions are just a sampling of what you might consider important questions, but my hope is that no matter what our questions may be, Christ will always be the cornerstone of our decisions.

Some questions that I look at in my life are, where does Christ's Light shine in my life? Am I a beacon in my every day duties? Am I a beacon to my family? Am I a beacon to my friends? Am I a beacon to strangers or my "enemies"? How can I be a better beacon than I've been in the past? My hope and prayer is that Christ remains a focus of all of our lives, the whole year thru. Paraphrasing Gordon, from his children's sermon, "We can't put Jesus away with all the Christmas decorations".

A hymn I really like is "We Are Called" by David Haas. It's # 720 in the ELW. David's words, in this hymn, echo the words of Bernadette Farrell's hymn mentioned above. The refrain of "We Are Called" is: "We are called to act with Justice, we are called to love tenderly; we are called to serve one another, to walk humbly with God."

May we all, always walk humbly with God.
