

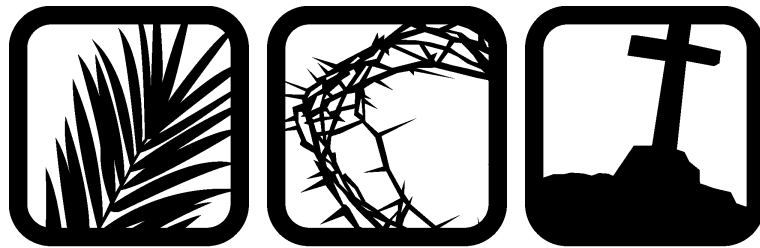

Council Notes —Chris Gillette, President

To keep you – the congregation – better informed, the council will include a monthly article in The Vine that summarizes all of our actions. This month’s article features the four meetings since the Annual Meeting in January. The council met in special session as part of its annual retreat on Saturday, February 5, 2011 and accepted the resignation of Audrey Fairchild-Ehm as Youth Minister effective February 28, 2011. Also approved at this meeting was a separation package for Audrey that consisted of one week of her current compensation for every week of her service to Prince of Peace for a total of 12 weeks. The council’s regularly scheduled meeting on Tuesday, February 15 saw the formation of two ad hoc committees and a new task force. The new ad hoc committee is led by Worship Life Area Coordinator Deb Cordes and is charged to create a policy concerning the use of sound and video in the church. The ad-hoc Governance Committee was recreated to review and update the constitution and by-laws of Prince of Peace. The South Property Task Force, led by Service & Advocacy Life Area Coordinator Carol Swanson was appointed. (Please see page 7 for details.) Finally, the council set Sunday, June 26, 2011 at 11:30 AM for a special congregation meeting. The purpose of this meeting includes: approving changes recommended by the ad hoc Governance Committee and approving the 2011-2012 budget.

In March the council again met twice. On Tuesday, March 8, the council met in special session to approve the formation of a search committee for the purpose of hiring an Interim Youth Ministry Coordinator. The part-time position will not exceed twenty hours per week and will terminate concurrent with the start date of the new staffing configuration. Also approved was a motion to allow the Finance Committee to hire a Financial Consultant to A) Reconcile the balance of the books for the close of the fiscal year and B) recommend modifications to current financial reporting system to better match the congregation’s needs. The pay for this person will not exceed \$500. The council’s regularly scheduled meeting on Tuesday, March 15 saw the formation of a new task force. The Capital Improvement Task Force will develop a comprehensive plan to address physical facility and campus improvement. More information will be available in next month’s Vine. The council also began the budget process.

Message from Senior Pastor Anita Beste

Hunger was a theme that kept coming up in March.

We participated in Minnesota Food Share's March drive to gather food and money to help stock over 300 food shelves throughout Minnesota. And meeting that basic need for food and nutrition for everyday life is extremely important and mandated by our reading of the Bible.



But there's another kind of hunger that we tend to also. Two Sundays in a row, I was struck by it. One Sunday the Chancel Choir sang this refrain over and over again:

O Lord, there's a hungerin' in my soul.

O Lord, there's a hungerin' in my soul.

O Lord, there's a hungerin' in my soul – oh my soul.

Fill it up, Lord, and make me whole.

And the next Sunday, when the gospel reading told us of Jesus being tempted to turn stones into bread, we heard him quote Deuteronomy 8:3 to the tempter in the wilderness:

Jesus answered, "It is written, 'One does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God.'" Matthew 4:4

I believe human beings are hardwired for spiritual hunger just as surely as we experience physical hunger. I still remember pondering this quote as a young girl when I stumbled upon it in a slender book of poetry and quotes I'd been given:

If I had but two loaves of bread,

I would sell one and buy hyacinth,

for it would feed my soul.

Spiritual hunger – perhaps meeting that need is part of the mission before us as a congregation.

As the Transition Team has listened to our congregation and distilled some themes, we've heard a strong interest in ministry to and with youth, and to and with seniors. Both age groups need ministering to; both age groups have gifts to share in ministering to others. And I would add that we will also want to tend to the decades in between – like the parents of our children and youth. And the adult children of our seniors – those 20 and 30-somethings who may be searching for spiritual food. And what about all the disaffected baby boomers in our community who may be hungering, but have not found their way into meaningful worship or a faith community where they could explore and grow spiritually?

There's a hungerin' in all our souls. And those of us reading this newsletter have been gathered into the fellowship of Prince of Peace in worship, in service, in study – as a way for God to *fill this hungerin' soul up, and make us whole*. Now we get to discover new ways to invite others into the joy and hard work of that hungerin' too!

On Vitality – We Are One in Mission



Where are we in the process?

The Transition Team will soon complete its work and present an initial draft of the Ministry Site Profile (MSP) to both the Church Council and the Congregation for approval (April/May). If the MSP is approved, it is intended for use by Prince of Peace Lutheran Church to call an ordained or lay rostered minister (Associate in Ministry, Deaconess or Diaconal Minister) of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. In addition and before interviews with candidates would begin, a special meeting of the congregation will be called to elect a Call Committee. The Call Committee would interview all candidates for the position.

How is a Call Committee selected?

The Call Committee, according to Prince of Peace Lutheran Church's Constitution, will include: *"the congregation President, Vice President and at least five members elected by the congregation, one of which shall be a Congregation Council Member."* The Saint Paul Area Synod recommends that care be given to the composition of the Call Committee and, that it *"should intentionally reflect the makeup of the congregation. There should be a diverse representation of gender, age, and ethnic/racial identity on the Committee. All segments of the ministry of the congregation should be represented (Worship, Youth, Education, Evangelism, etc.). Beyond these, there should also be a balance of long-term and newer members, people from different element of the congregation, drawing upon a variety of contributing styles and gifts. An effective Committee is usually more than five people and fewer than nine."*

If the Ministry Site Profile is not approved and/or the congregation decides not to seek to call an ordained or lay rostered minister of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, what happens?

If the congregation decides not to seek an ordained or lay rostered minister, the congregation can ask the Congregation Council to take the necessary steps to prepare an alternative staffing plan for Prince of Peace Lutheran Church. This plan would, also, come before the congregation for approval before implementation.

There is still work to be completed by the Transition Team, the Congregation Council, and decisions to be made by the Congregation before a Call Committee is elected or an alternative plan for staffing is approved by the members of Prince of Peace Lutheran Church.

As our discernment continues, please take time to reflect upon and to pray the three verses of "We All Are One in Mission" (ELW 576), which begins: *"We all are one in mission; we all are one in call, our varied gifts united by Christ, the Lord of all. A single great commission compels us from above to plan and work together that all may know Christ's love."*

In the poem we're using during lent, I have found the contrast of the darkness and light fascinating. (Violence/Peace; Suffering/Healing; Death/Life; Weakness/Power; Capital Punishment/Mercy and Forgiveness and Vicious Hatred/Key of Love) These have all made me look at the image of Christ on the cross in a new way. With so much suffering in the world I sometimes tend to focus on the Risen Christ more than Christ on the cross. This series has allowed me to focus on both the risen and suffering Christ each and every week of Lent. I'm hoping to take these images with me throughout the rest of my Christian Journey. I hope you have found the Wednesday Lenten Services meaningful, too.

I would like you focus on Luke 23: 32-43 again. To me this text really shows the risen and suffering faces of Christ. Christ is suffering on the cross and yet is forgiving to the criminal. I like to picture ELW 581 You Are Mine, as what Christ is saying **to me** from the cross. Here are the words to the hymn by David Haas; Verse 1— *I will come to you in the silence, I will lift you up from all you fear. You will hear my voice, I claim you as my choice. Be still and know I am here.* (Refrain) *Do not be afraid, I am with you. I have called you each by name. Come and follow me, I will bring you home; I love you and you are mine.* Verse 2— *I am hope for all who are hopeless, I am eyes for all who long to see. In the shadows of the night, I will be your light. Come and rest in me.* (Refrain) Verse 3— *I am strength for all the despairing, healing for the ones who dwell in shame. All the blind will see, the lame will all run free, and all will know my name.* (Refrain) Verse 4— *I am the Word that leads all to freedom, I am the peace the world cannot give. I will call your name, embracing all your pain. Stand up, now walk and live!* (Refrain)

This Easter I pray that Christ is alive in you and that you know you are His.

Council Corner—Christer Cederberg, Treasurer

Over the past twelve years I have worked out at my local YMCA. My exercise routine often includes time on a StairMaster, where I pick my "mode". I always pick "Manual" over other "Random" options. I am in control, and off I go on Level 4!

Life, however, does not let us pick a "mode". Long ago I pushed "Steady Job", and I was on a nice run. Then a year ago, I suddenly lost my job. Did God hit the "Random" button?

I tried mixing stressful job-search with rest for nine gestational months, and suddenly I had two jobs coming ... twins? One job came with a paycheck and lots of advance notice. In mid November, I would be an engineer again.

The other job came suddenly. Pastor Anita asked me to become our Volunteer Temporary Interim Parish Administrator. I had never been that before, I thought, so maybe I could learn a few new things.

On day one, the daycare had issues with doors and locks; we needed bulletins for Sunday; the phone kept ringing; I made payroll and paid bills (at least my business schooling came in handy); and I fixed the leaking kitchen sink before a cooking marathon started (it made me feel important). And we looked for my replacement...

Three weeks later KC came on board. Yeah! The two of us now shared the multitude of duties in the front office, and I showed her all I had learned over the past weeks.

These duties also are shared with some very helpful office volunteers. I do not know how Prince of Peace could function without them or others who, for instance, tend to facilities or process contributions. Volunteers come in all colors and shapes, but we appreciate each one and the work they do! If you come to church "only" on Wednesday evenings or Sundays then you may not have noticed, but our building is full of life every day of the week.

Well, my job as a Parish Administrator came to an end, but I still work on our accounting, and as our new Treasurer I drive our budget work. So what might I ask from you now that you followed my exercise this far?

- As our "accountant", I ask you to please consider giving monthly using Simply Giving. Please deduct from your checking account to avoid extra charges for the church and to simplify our accounting work. This is an easy one.
- As our Treasurer, I ask you to consider going to the next level. It is perfectly OK to increase your pledge any time of the year. Remember, you are in control. Give Level 5 a run.

South Property Task Force is Formed

About a dozen years ago Prince of Peace purchased the acreage to the south of us. In recent years, this area has been used for a garden, for outdoor worship, for occasional picnics or lawn games. How can we develop this land to further God's blessings on us and this community? Suggestions, designated money, and partial plans have been given but not fully developed. Because we are in the midst of a transitional period, the Social Concerns Committee decided to bring a motion to the council regarding the vacant lot.

At a recent meeting the Council passed a motion appointing "a Task Force to further develop existing plans and receive additional ideas for the development of the vacant lot....The chair shall recruit congregational members representing Property Committee, Worship Committee, Youth Committee, Social Concerns Committee, Children's Ministry, Senior Ministry, and two at large members for the Task Force." The Council appointed me to chair this Task Force.

Having people from the various committees will help us develop a short term plan and long term plan that reflect the dreams and the needs of the congregation. First Communion – For Children of All Ages

Children of all ages are welcome to receive communion at Prince of Peace. Parents – together with their children – decide when their children will first receive this sacrament based on several factors including interest expressed, child development, family tradition, siblings, etc.

We do ask that children receive some preparation in anticipation of their first communion. This preparation fosters an age-appropriate understanding of participation in communion as one of God's means of grace.

Preparation for First Communion can be done in one of two ways:

1. Speak to one of the pastors, arrange to meet as a family for instruction and preparation, and then participate any communion Sunday throughout the year; or
2. Attend – as a family – the First Communion Preparation sessions offered during Lent and receive first communion together at the Maundy Thursday service.

April 21 at the 7 pm service.**

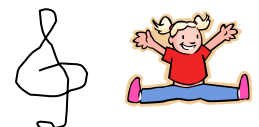
Sessions on preparing for First Communion will be planned after we know the number and ages of the children. We will contact you.

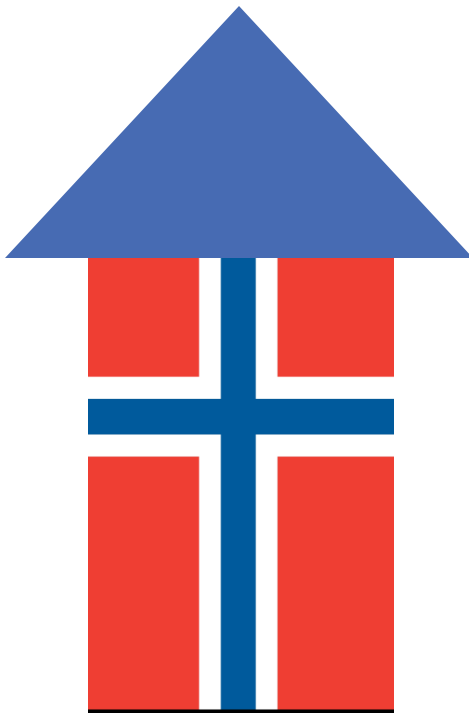
