On Working Together...

As I write this article the State of Minnesota is in day 11 of a government shutdown and on the Federal level this country stands on the brink of a fiscal disaster. There appears to be no end in sight to the conflicts even after seven (7) months of trying to work out differences. While there is no one answer to the problems that have us in this gridlock, I do want to offer one solution to help bring an end to the impasse. I want to send the congregation of Prince of Peace first to Saint Paul and then to Washington D.C to teach our representatives what good things can happen when people work together. Those representatives would learn from us that the issues that change brings can be solved through consensus and compromise. They would learn not to underestimate the power of people to step up to meet challenges. They would learn that the three (3) most important pronouns are not me, myself, and I but are you, us and them. They would learn to listen and respect all sides of an issue and to show this openness in conversations with each other. Finally, they would learn what special people make up the congregation of Prince of Peace and how we will continue to pray and work together to meet whatever the future will bring.

... and Forgiveness

We sat talking for close to five hours. Across the table was a person I had worked with a while ago, someone I considered a friend back then and we parted, when one of us left, on less than good terms. I have to admit that the rift between us was my fault. I was caught up in a moment and let my judgment lapse in the actions I took. So we sat there talking about where things had gone wrong when I heard words coming out of my mouth that are strictly out of character for me. “I apologize for what I did, I’m sorry.” The person I was with looked at me, nodded and smiled. It was then that I finally understood what my best friend Gail had been trying to tell me for 20 years. There is a difference between saying “I was wrong” or “I made a mistake” and telling a person “I apologize” or “I’m sorry”. The first two phrases are excuses, the last two are an acknowledgement.

My acquaintance and I spent the rest of the evening talking about our lives, our hopes and the future. We laughed a lot and cried a little. It turned out to be a good evening. While we may not ever spend another moment face to face, for a segment in time the person I was with had a measure of understanding and the knowledge of how much I respected them. I took from the night the lifting of guilt and peace of mind. Thus is the power of confession and forgiveness.

Members of Prince of Peace,

Thank you for welcoming me into Prince of Peace community as your Temporary Parish Administrator! For the last nine months, I have experienced a congregation of engaged Lutherans doing God’s work through many transitions, joys and challenges. I don’t know what’s next for me but I do know that I leave Prince of Peace more blessed than when I arrived.

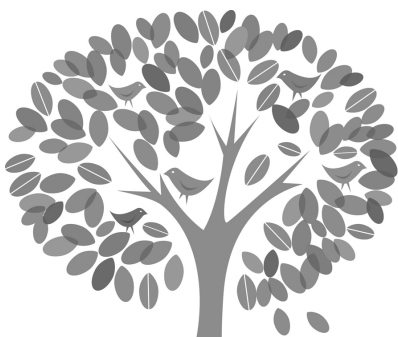
discernment of this call committee is an important next step as we begin a new chapter in ministry together.

Lawn and Garden

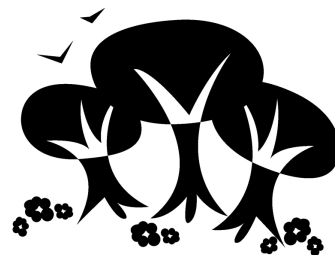

Paul Thompson faithfully changes our signage as the summer service times change and when special events need to be posted. Thank you Paul!

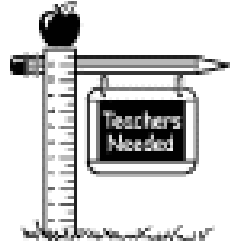

What Does September 11, 2001 Mean to You?

The first Sunday after Labor Day – when we resume our fall worship schedule – is September 11th. It will be the 10th anniversary of that tragic day in our nation’s history. Our observance of that anniversary will include reverence and remembrance, and gratitude for the gifts of faith and community. We invite you to ponder the meaning of that day and the 10 years since and write a memory, a prayer, or even a short essay. Where were you that day? How have things changed since then?
