Message from Pastor Anita Beste

Listening to God.
Listening to Each Other.
Listening to the Community.

Those are the things that bring me joy as a parish pastor. I can do committee meetings and budgets and worry about the roof getting fixed (see below). But it's

Dwelling in the Word;
Hearing the stories of my parishioners; and
Seeing how we can be a part of our local community that really gives me energy in my work.

You've heard me say that Prince of Peace is poised for a new chapter in our congregational life and ministry. After three years of conflict and three years of walking with a dying pastor and one year of good transition work, we are now poised for a new chapter of mission and ministry together. So what will that chapter look like?

What strengths shall we build on?
What traditions will we carry forward? What new things introduce?
How shall we reach out to new people?
Are there ways we could be of greater service to our community?
What is God calling us to be and do in this time and place?

I invite you to be a part of the process in answering those questions – and more – about what our next chapter will look like. Prince of Peace has been invited by the St. Paul Area Synod to be one of 6-8 churches who enter into an 18-month mission renewal process coached by Assistants to the Bishop Susan Miller and Paul Erickson.

The process begins with a team of 4-8 of us from Prince of Peace listening to God through intentional and shared Bible reading for several months. Then the process and participation widens as a period of intentional listening to each other in the congregation is initiated. After that we find ways to listen to the hopes and dreams and struggles of our neighborhoods and communities. And from there we begin to imagine and articulate and take steps toward a renewed mission for Prince of Peace.

I invite you to join me in this mission renewal process. The first workshop with the synod is Saturday, October 1st, 8:30 – 12 noon. Please let me know if you're interested.

P.S. By the way – the roof is getting fixed! They've been up there all this week. And a new furnace is being installed. Progress is being made thanks to the collective commitment of you – the people of this congregation – and to the hard work of the Capital Improvements Task Force to make it happen. Be sure you come to the 9:30 Adult Forum on Sunday, October 16, to hear more about next steps from them and to be a part of the process in establishing needs and priorities and timelines.



Message from Marie Olson Purcell, Interim Youth Ministry Coordinator

You're invited to become a PoP Youth Partner!

Come be a part of a wonderful new program at Prince of Peace! This is for all aged-adults, whether you have children or not, whether you recently graduated from high school or whether high school is a distance memory, *our current youth need you!*

Our new program, PoP Youth Partners, is an exciting opportunity for our church community to demonstrate what our recent surveys have portrayed—that Prince of Peace is a church which values its youth and wants to support its youth program! As the youth continue to experience transition in their leadership, still not knowing who the new associate pastor will be, it is especially important for them to experience support and care from the adults of Prince of Peace!

Support comes in a variety of forms. The PoP Youth Partner program will offer a little financial support as our youth prepare to attend the 2012 ELCA Youth Gathering in New Orleans this July. But more importantly, the PoP Youth Partner program will also offer support through shared prayers and growing in relationship with one another.

So how does the program work?

Financial support

When you sign up to be a PoP Youth Partner we ask that you would commit to giving **\$5 a month** for the 8 months (November-June) leading up to the Gathering. This comes to a total of only \$40. When you sign up you will receive monthly donation envelopes to help remind you that you walk this journey with the youth!

Prayers

We also ask our PoP Youth Partners for their **prayerful support**. Each month (November-June) you and the youth will receive a Postcard Prayer in the mail. We ask that you pray this prayer throughout the month.

Get to know the Youth!

Finally, we want you to get to know our youth! On **Wednesday, November 2nd** there will be a **meet & greet** event at 6:30pm in the Fellowship Hall. While our PoP Youth Partners support all the youth, at this event you will be matched up with one youth to get to know more personally.

Hear from the Youth!

As a PoP Youth Partner **you will receive two notes** from your Youth partner in which they will share with you what they are doing and learning in preparation for the Gathering.

Learn about the Gathering

Finally, in August or September (TBD) the youth will share their experiences at the Gathering during the PoP worship services. On this same Sunday, after the services, there will be an additional **Meet & Share** for the youth and PoP Youth Partners to reconnect!

We hope you will consider being a part of this wonderful new ministry!

ATTENTION ALL MEMBERS: We need more sound and video people. We are looking for people to be regulars or just help out once in awhile, whatever fits your availability. Training will be provided. Tom Frantz is stepping down from the sound team and I want to take this time to thank him for all he's done with the sound at Prince of Peace. We will still be providing recordings of the services, as long as we have people to make them, but Tom will not be editing them to make them as high a quality as they have been, so if anyone is interested in learning how to do that I believe Tom would be happy to give you lessons.

- Kenny will be doing a Spooky Music concert again this year. See the Spooky Music Article for more details.
- The choirs are still looking for more members, so if you want to join, but felt you missed the beginning, it's never too late to start!
- We will be using setting ten from the ELW for most of the traditional services thru Thanksgiving. This is the setting that uses hymns with different words for the different parts of the liturgy. I've had many positive comments on this setting in the past and hope you find it easy to follow and meaningful.
- World communion, Bread for the World and Reformation are all celebrated in October. Some of these we celebrate more than others, but they all give us a chance to remember that being part of the Lutheran Church is a global ministry. We worship each Sunday with our brothers and sisters in Tanzania even though we aren't directly communicating with them. We also worship with many other Protestant churches through hearing the same scripture readings that they are hearing. What message will their pastors be giving from these texts? We are just one small church in Roseville, but part of a large community around the state, nation and world.
- We will be using verses one and three from ELW 650 "In Christ There Is No East or West" for many of our Offertories through Thanksgiving. The music of this hymn is an African American Spiritual adapted by Harry T. Burleigh. The hymn itself was written by John Oxenham many years ago, but I think the words still ring true today. 1)"In Christ there is no east or west, in him no south or north, but one community of love throughout the whole wide earth." 3)"Join hands, disciples of the faith, whate'er your race may be. All children of the living God are surely kin to me." It is my prayer that we learn to live in harmony with our brothers and sisters in Roseville, Minnesota, USA and around the world.

Call Committee Updates

What has happened so far?

- The call committee has been meeting regularly, and is nearly ready to start interviewing candidates. We expect to receive a list of potential candidates from the Synod sometime in October.

What happens next?

- When we receive the list of potential candidates from the Synod, we will start scheduling interviews. Prior to this we will be conducting a "mock" interview, to help us practice and refine our interview questions. We plan to interview approximately seven candidates, and then may bring some candidates back for second interviews. Hopefully we'll have this process completed by sometime in November. Then the process continues with the selection of a candidate for recommendation, a congregational vote, and the acceptance of the call by the selected Pastor.

- Please join us in praying for God to grant wisdom, patience, and discernment to our call committee. The committee members are so thankful for your thoughts and prayers!

Council Notes— Chris Gillette, Council President



As Prince of Peace returns to the rhythm of the church year the Congregation Council met on Tuesday, September 13 to continue its work. A majority of the meeting was filled with reports from individuals, committees and task forces that have been working on various projects all summer.

- Marge Beauvais gave a presentation on the idea of a Columbarium at Prince of Peace. The council authorized the formation of an Ad-Hoc Committee to further explore this idea with Marge as the Chairperson.
- The treasure's report showed the good news that for the first two months of the 2011-12 fiscal year that income was greater than the budget and expenses were below the budgeted amount.
- Pastor Anita's report started with complimenting our new personnel (Office Manager Maureen Connelly and Financial Consultant Kathy Arveson) for their excellent work. Anita also announced the start of a new program Tuesdays at noon called "Feasting with the Word" that will examine the next Sunday's scripture texts. Finally, she reported about a St. Paul Area Synod program "Mission Renewal Process" to assist congregations in developing their mission. The council approved entry into this program.
- Vice President Dave Weiler presented the Personnel Committee report concerning the benefits package for the Office Manager. The recommendation of options for payment of health insurance benefits was approved later in the meeting.
- Erika Wold (Education) gave an update of the Call Committee's work. (Details of this work are located under a separate article in this edition of The Vine.)
- Caryn Josephson (Stewardship) from the Capital Improvement Task Force (CITF) and Carol Swanson (Service & Advocacy) from the South Property Task Force (now working with the CITF) spoke about the status of the "Safety, Stewardship and Support of Ministry" projects that have been identified in Phase II of the capital improvement plan. The CITF will present their work to the congregation during the Education Hour on Sunday, October 16.
- Betchen Oberdorfer (Community Life) announced the return of Sunday morning treats with coffee. She also reported on work to have an updated Church Picture Directory in the near future.
- Work continued on the Building and Equipment Use Policy for possible adoption at the October meeting.

Responders Revisited

Prince of Peace has a long and successful tradition of reaching out to the community at large and to our own congregation as well. *Responders* has been the program that reaches out to people in our congregation who may welcome some help with tasks they cannot do on their own. Often this has been yard cleaning or snow removal. But, it could be anything that a partner needs done. With an eye towards multi-generational congregational life we are taking a long-standing practice and putting a new spin to it.

Here is how it all works:

Responder Teams:

Any combination of youth and adults who will commit to a school year of one-to-one service.

Partner:

Any member of the congregation that may need help with a task they cannot do on their own.

How do I get involved?

- Sign-up. Both responders and partners need to sign-up.
- Once we have several teams and a list of partners we will match them up. Responders can sign-up as a family, a team or individual.
- Teams and partners will be assigned for the school year.
- After that you are on your own. Teams and partners decide what needs to be done, when and how. SIMPLE!!! *Registration forms in the coffee area.*

Traditions and Transitions

It's October now and when I think of October, I think of pumpkins. I suspect this is probably not surprising to anyone - this really is not an unusual association, I know. Yet when I reflect on "tradition", I also think of pumpkins. *That* may be a surprise. Growing up, my family *always* had a "pumpkin hunt" in the fall. On one weekend day, within the few weeks leading up to Halloween, we would hop into our car (I mostly remember our brown Chevy Caprice) and head out to a "sincere" pumpkin patch. (We could certainly *not* just go to a local store to buy an already harvested pumpkin). Each of us would then hunt for our own perfect pumpkin for the holiday and bring it home. It was an annual event for us. Simple. Fun. Family building. Clearly memorable. Other traditions stick out in my mind, but I probably think of pumpkins the most.

We have traditions in our church as well (*please pause for a moment to think of your favorites*). Traditions are a part of who we are as they bind us together in the present and ground us in our past. In ways they connect us with our future as well. They build us as part of God's family. My hope is that we will carry traditions forward as we continue our transition at Prince of Peace.

But change is coming around the bend as well. We often hear "change is good", and we are always in a state of transition to one extent or another. In many situations, if you are not willing to adapt, you are often left behind. Certainly changes can end up being mistakes, but progress and improvement cannot occur without change. I know I am always frustrated when I am forced to learn a new computer system upgrade when I feel that my current system is just fine. Yet, more common than not, in the end, the new upgrade *is* an improvement. Our congregation is still in a state of transition, and we are actively in the call process. It is clear that changes are coming. I am sure that it may not always be easy, but I am certainly optimistic and excited about the future. Why would I not be? We have a strong and involved congregation with great leadership and direction. We are ready. As we continue, my hope is that we welcome and embrace both traditions and transitions.
